## FAQ's

- Can students take the PERT more than once? Yes, but they must wait 30 days before retaking it. However, students can only take the PERT twice within two years.
- Do students have to take all sections of the PERT if they have passed some of the sections? No, they can take just the sections they still need to pass.
- **Do the PERT scores expire?** If students pass the PERT and do not take any courses within two years, their scores will expire. PERT math scores are only valid for 2 years unless students enroll in a math course.
- Can students take DE courses on PSC's campus? Yes, students can take courses on McKeel's and/or PSC's campuses.
- **Do McKeel teachers teach dual enrollment courses?** We currently have five McKeel teachers who teach courses.
- If a student receives their AA degree does that disqualify them for scholarship opportunities? They may be ineligible for Freshman scholarships at some institutions. It is imperative they check with each individual college/university they are interested in attending to clarify their individual policies.
- What is FTEA? FTEA means Full Time Early Admission. Seniors are the only ones that can meet FTEA requirements. FTEA is taking 12-15 credit hours on PSC's campus and remaining a McKeel student.
- Can students take dual enrollment courses during the summer? Yes, students can register for summer courses.
- What if students don't earn a passing math score? Students can take up to 12 college credits
  without having a passing math score as long as they have earned passing reading and writing
  scores.
- Where can students locate their cumulative unweighted GPA? The unweighted GPA is listed on the 1st-semester report card.
- Where can a student locate their PSAT scores? Students can access their PSAT scores through McKeel Systems under the Test Scores tab.
- Do students have to take the PERT at McKeel? No, students can take the PERT through PSC.

## **HOW TO TAKE THE PERT IN PERSON**

- 1. Apply to Polk State College. You will receive a welcome letter via email with additional information.
- 2. To request to take the PERT, please send an email to the email address below that applies to you: Email <u>DEregistration@polk.edu</u>

The subject of the email should be DE PERT testing. Students must include the following information in their email:

- Student full name
- Polk State ID#
- Name of the high school
- Sections of the PERT the student will be taking (Reading, Math, English)
- A statement that the student is taking the test for dual enrollment purposes

## Please allow at least 2 business days to process your initial request.

- 3. You will receive an email with instructions for scheduling your appointment from <a href="mailto:PERT@Polk.edu">PERT@Polk.edu</a> within 2 business days of being approved for testing by an advisor.
- 4. All PERT testing is done by appointment, which must be made *at least one day in advance*.
